Characteristics

Genus & Species: Rosmarinus officinalis **Protection Status:** PP18,192; COPF Open. **USDA Zone:** Zone 6. (-10°F or -23°C). Bloom: Good dark blooms.

Bloom Time: Early summer - fall.

Foliage: Mid green needle like foliage with high oil count. Great for cooking.

Tight bushy habit, upright to trialing in time. 12" x 12". Habit: Softwood cuttings. License required for propagation. **Propagation:**

4.5" Quarts: 6-8 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting). 6" Gallons: 10-12 weeks from a 72 cell transplant (Spring Planting).
